The premium must be used to fund additional and sustainable improvements to the provision of PE and sport, for the benefit of primary-aged pupils to encourage the development of healthy, active lifestyles. The Secretary of State does not consider the following expenditure as falling within the scope of additional or sustainable improvement:

- employing coaches or specialist teachers to cover planning preparation and assessment (PPA) arrangements - these should come out of schools' core staffing budgets
- teaching the minimum requirements of the existing PE curriculum.

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Our objectives are:

- To enhance our provision for PE and sport and to enable pupils to develop a healthy, active lifestyle
- To increase the opportunities for all pupils to access a wide variety of PE and Sports
- Increased confidence, knowledge and skills of all staff in teaching PE and sport
- Increased participation in competitive sport
- Broader experience of a range of sports and activities offered to all pupils.

Our rationale for spending the money in this way is:

Enabling them to be physically literate supports their development as competent, confident and healthy movers.”
